

# ENGLISH AS A SECOND LANGUAGE (ESL)

## ESL C011N 36-144 Hours (36-144 lecture hours) Sentence Structure 1

**Advisory:** New students are advised to complete the ESL placement process in order to select their initial course level.

**Grading Mode:** P/NP/SP Noncredit  
Not Transferable.

An intensive beginning English grammar course for non-native English speakers. A survey of simple sentence structures in American English. Emphasis on developing proficiency and fluency in constructing grammatically correct English sentences. Noncredit. Pass/No Pass/Satisfactory Progress. (NOT DEGREE APPLICABLE).

## ESL C012N 36-144 Hours (36-144 lecture hours) Reading and Writing 1

**Advisory:** New students are advised to complete the ESL placement process to determine their initial placement.

**Grading Mode:** P/NP/SP Noncredit  
Not Transferable.

A beginning-level course in English reading and writing for non-native English speakers. Emphasis on developing vocabulary and communication skills necessary for reading and comprehending simple, short paragraphs and writing simple sentences. Noncredit. Pass/No Pass/Satisfactory Progress. (NOT DEGREE APPLICABLE).

## ESL C013N 36-180 Hours (36-180 lecture hours) Listening and Conversation 1

**Advisory:** New students are advised to complete the ESL placement process to determine their initial placement.

**Grading Mode:** P/NP/SP Noncredit  
Not Transferable.

An intensive beginning-level course in English listening comprehension and oral communication for non-native English speakers. Emphasis on skills necessary to comprehend spoken English and to speak English fluently and accurately. Noncredit. Pass/No Pass/Satisfactory Progress. (NOT DEGREE APPLICABLE).

## ESL C016N 18 Hours (18 lecture hours) Basic Computer Terminology and Skills

**Grading Mode:** P/NP/SP Noncredit  
Not Transferable.

This course will introduce ESL students to basic computer terminology and offer them instruction and practice in acquiring the skills that are necessary to navigate a Windows environment and learning management systems to succeed in their ESL courses and to meet other educational, employment-related, or personal goals. Noncredit. Pass/No Pass/Satisfactory Progress. (NOT DEGREE APPLICABLE).

## ESL C020N 48-144 Hours (48-144 lecture hours) Integrated English Skills 1A

**Advisory:** Students are advised to complete the ESL Guided Self-Placement in order to select their initial course level.

**Grading Mode:** P/NP/SP Noncredit  
Not Transferable.

Formerly C422, C065N. This is a very basic course for low-beginning non-native English speakers focusing on English language skills necessary for simple reading, writing, listening, and speaking tasks in classroom situations. Emphasis on correct sentence structure, basic vocabulary, reading comprehension, listening comprehension, and correct pronunciation. Noncredit. Open Entry/Open Exit. Pass/No Pass/Satisfactory Progress. (NOT DEGREE APPLICABLE).

## ESL C022N 144 Hours (144 lecture hours) Reading, Writing, and Grammar 1B

**Advisory:** Students who have completed ESL C011N Sentence Structure 1 with a Pass are encouraged to enroll in this course or students who have completed ESL C012N Reading and Writing 1 with a Pass are encouraged to enroll in this course or new students are advised to complete the ESL placement process to determine their initial placement.

**Grading Mode:** P/NP/SP Noncredit  
Not Transferable.

This is an intensive reading, writing, and grammar course for beginning-level non-native English speakers who are preparing for general college coursework. This course provides an introduction to reading and interpreting short reading passages on familiar topics and writing sentences in the simple and progressive present and past tenses. Students will become familiar with grammatical terms in preparation for higher-level academic courses. Noncredit. Pass/No Pass/Satisfactory Progress. (NOT DEGREE APPLICABLE).

## ESL C023N 72 Hours (72 lecture hours) Speaking and Listening 1B

**Advisory:** Students who have completed ESL C013N Listening and Conversation 1 with a Pass are encouraged to enroll in this course or new students are advised to complete the ESL placement process to determine their initial placement.

**Grading Mode:** P/NP/SP Noncredit  
Not Transferable.

This is an oral communication, pronunciation, and listening comprehension course for beginning-level non-native English speakers. Emphasis on mastering accurate pronunciation and building listening skills to facilitate accurate comprehension of spoken English. Noncredit. Pass/No Pass/Satisfactory Progress. (NOT DEGREE APPLICABLE).

**ESL C025N****36 Hours (36 lecture hours)****Pronunciation Skills - Beginning**

**Advisory:** New students are advised to complete the ESL placement process to determine their initial placement.

**Grading Mode:** P/NP/SP Noncredit  
Not Transferable.

This is a pronunciation and communication course for non-native speakers of English at the beginning-level of proficiency. Emphasis is placed on accurate pronunciation of American English and oral/aural communication skills necessary for employment, social, and academic situations. Noncredit. Pass/No Pass/Satisfactory Progress. (NOT DEGREE APPLICABLE).

**ESL C026N****18 Hours (18 lecture hours)****Computer Terminology and Applications**

**Advisory:** ESL C016N; Students are expected to be able to read and write simple questions and answers in English and know basic computer skills such as logging into a school computer with a school username and password, navigating the internet to websites, and logging into school learning management systems with a school username and password before enrolling in ESL C026N.

**Grading Mode:** P/NP/SP Noncredit  
Not Transferable.

This course will introduce English language learners to computer terminology and offer them instruction and practice in navigating a variety of English language learning activities in computer applications that are used both in college coursework as well as employment. Noncredit. Pass/No Pass/Satisfactory Progress. (NOT DEGREE APPLICABLE).

**ESL C028N****36-72 Hours (36-72 lecture hours)****English as a Second Language for Citizenship 1**

**Advisory:** Students who have completed ESL C013N Listening and Conversation 1 with a Pass are encouraged to enroll in this course or new students are advised to complete the ESL placement process to determine their initial placement.

**Grading Mode:** P/NP/SP Noncredit  
Not Transferable.

This beginning-level noncredit course is the first in a series of two courses for non-native English speakers to prepare for the USCIS naturalization process with emphasis on developing reading, writing, listening, and speaking skills necessary for successful completion of the USCIS Naturalization Interview and Test. Students will gain basic knowledge of U.S. geography, government, and history. Noncredit. Pass/No Pass/Satisfactory Progress. (NOT DEGREE APPLICABLE).

**ESL C032N****144 Hours (144 lecture hours)****Reading, Writing, and Grammar 2A**

**Advisory:** Students who have completed ESL C022N Reading, Writing, and Grammar 1B with a Pass are encouraged to enroll in this course or new students are advised to complete the ESL placement process to determine their initial placement.

**Grading Mode:** P/NP/SP Noncredit  
Not Transferable.

This is an intensive reading, writing, and grammar course for high-beginning level non-native English speakers who are preparing for college coursework. This course provides practice in reading and interpreting short reading passages, writing sentences in the simple, progressive, and perfect past and present tenses, and writing short paragraphs. Noncredit. Pass/No Pass/Satisfactory Progress. (NOT DEGREE APPLICABLE).

**ESL C033N****72 Hours (72 lecture hours)****Speaking and Listening 2A**

**Advisory:** Students who have completed ESL C023N Speaking and Listening 1B with a Pass are encouraged to enroll in this course or new students are advised to complete the ESL placement process to determine their initial placement.

**Grading Mode:** P/NP/SP Noncredit  
Not Transferable.

This is an oral communication, accent reduction, and listening comprehension course for high-beginning level non-native English speakers who are preparing for general college coursework. Emphasis on accurate pronunciation and communication and listening skills necessary for classroom situations and life skills. Noncredit. Pass/No Pass/Satisfactory Progress. (NOT DEGREE APPLICABLE).

**ESL C035N****144 Hours (144 lecture hours)****Grammar, Reading, and Writing 3A**

**Advisory:** Students who have completed ESL C042N with a grade of Pass are encouraged to enroll in this course; new students are advised to complete the ESL placement process to determine their initial placement.

**Grading Mode:** P/NP/SP Noncredit  
Not Transferable.

This is an intensive, integrated grammar, reading, and writing course for intermediate students who are non-native speakers of English. This course provides an introduction to literal and critical reading and responding to unsimplified texts and practice in writing unified paragraphs with a topic sentence and supporting details with an emphasis on accuracy in grammar and mechanics. Noncredit. Pass/No Pass/Satisfactory Progress. (NOT DEGREE APPLICABLE).

**ESL C038N 36-72 Hours (36-72 lecture hours)****English as a Second Language for Citizenship 2**

**Advisory:** Students who have completed ESL C023N Speaking and Listening 1B with a Pass are encouraged to enroll in this course or students who have completed ESL C028N English as a Second Language for Citizenship 1 with a Pass are encouraged to enroll in this course or new students are advised to complete the ESL placement process to determine their initial placement.

**Grading Mode:** P/NP/SP Noncredit  
Not Transferable.

This intermediate-level noncredit course is the second in a series of two courses for non-native English speakers to prepare for the USCIS naturalization process with emphasis on developing reading, writing, listening, and speaking skills necessary for successful completion of the USCIS Naturalization Interview and Test. Students will gain basic knowledge of U.S. geography, government, and history, and prepare for the citizenship interview. Noncredit. Pass/No Pass/Satisfactory Progress. (NOT DEGREE APPLICABLE).

**ESL C042N 144 Hours (144 lecture hours)****Reading, Writing, and Grammar 2B**

**Advisory:** Students who have completed ESL C032N Reading, Writing, and Grammar 2A with a Pass are encouraged to enroll in this course or new students are advised to complete the ESL placement process to determine their initial placement.

**Grading Mode:** P/NP/SP Noncredit  
Not Transferable.

This is an intensive, noncredit, integrated reading, writing, and grammar course for intermediate-level English Language Learners (ELL) who are preparing for college coursework. This course provides practice in reading and analyzing short text selections, writing sentences in the simple, progressive, and perfect past, present, and future tenses and writing paragraphs that include a topic sentence and supporting details. Noncredit. Pass/No Pass/Satisfactory Progress. (NOT DEGREE APPLICABLE).

**ESL C043N 72 Hours (72 lecture hours)****Speaking and Listening 2B**

**Advisory:** Students who have completed ESL C033N Speaking and Listening 2A with a Pass are encouraged to enroll in this course or new students are advised to complete the ESL placement process to determine their initial placement.

**Grading Mode:** P/NP/SP Noncredit  
Not Transferable.

This is a noncredit oral communication, accent reduction, and listening comprehension course for intermediate-level English Language Learners (ELL) who are preparing for general college coursework or career training. This course focuses on communication and listening skills necessary for classroom situations. Noncredit. Pass/No Pass/Satisfactory Progress. (NOT DEGREE APPLICABLE).

**ESL C049N 72 Hours (72 lecture hours)****Listening/Speaking Skills 3A**

**Advisory:** Students who have completed ESL C043N with a grade of Pass are encouraged to enroll in this course; new students are advised to complete the ESL placement process to determine their initial placement.

**Grading Mode:** P/NP/SP Noncredit  
Not Transferable.

This course is designed to meet the needs of California residents by offering them a non-credit option of this level of ESL in order to ease their financial burden. In doing so, students will have enough financial aid to complete all of Coastline's ESL program before moving on to college-level courses. This course combines listening and speaking in an integrated curriculum designed to increase efficiency and accelerate students' progress in gaining English proficiency. The intermediate level is the fourth in a series of six levels. Noncredit. Pass/No Pass/Satisfactory Progress. (NOT DEGREE APPLICABLE).

**ESL C081N 72 Hours (72 lecture hours)****Grammar and Sentence Structure-High Intermediate to Advanced**

**Advisory:** Students who have completed ESL C042N Reading, Writing, and Grammar 2B with a Pass are encouraged to enroll in this course or new students are advised to complete the ESL placement process to determine their initial placement.

**Grading Mode:** P/NP/SP Noncredit  
Not Transferable.

This non-credit grammar and sentence-structure course is appropriate for high-intermediate and advanced-level ESL students who want to improve their sentence-level writing skills for increased success in academic or vocational studies, career advancement, U.S. citizenship, or other personal purposes. Noncredit. Pass/No Pass/Satisfactory Progress. (NOT DEGREE APPLICABLE.)

**ESL C083N 36-108 Hours (36-108 lecture hours)****Speaking and Listening Skills-High Intermediate to Advanced**

**Advisory:** Students who have completed ESL C043N Speaking and Listening 2B with a Pass are encouraged to enroll in this course or new students are advised to complete the ESL placement process to determine their initial placement.

**Grading Mode:** P/NP/SP Noncredit  
Not Transferable.

This is a listening comprehension, oral communication, and pronunciation course for high-intermediate and advanced-level ESL students. Emphasis is placed on participating in class discussions, developing note-taking skills, and responding to short lectures, dialogues, and narratives. This course builds necessary skills for workplace, academic, and social situations. Noncredit. Pass/No Pass/Satisfactory Progress. (NOT DEGREE APPLICABLE.)

**ESL C084N** **36 Hours (36 lecture hours)**  
**English Idioms and Contemporary Expressions-High Intermediate to Advanced**

**Advisory:** Students who have completed ESL C042N Reading, Writing, and Grammar 2B with a Pass are encouraged to enroll in this course or new students are advised to complete the ESL placement process to determine their initial placement.

**Grading Mode:** P/NP/SP Noncredit  
Not Transferable.

This is a high intermediate to advanced ESL course focusing on high-frequency American English idioms, phrases, and contemporary expressions used by native speakers in workplace, social, and academic settings. Noncredit. Pass/No Pass/Satisfactory Progress. (NOT DEGREE APPLICABLE.)

**ESL C085N** **36 Hours (36 lecture hours)**  
**Pronunciation Skills - Intermediate to Advanced**

**Advisory:** Students who have completed ESL C043N Speaking and Listening 2B with a Pass are encouraged to enroll in this course or new students are advised to complete the ESL placement process to determine their initial placement.

**Grading Mode:** P/NP/SP Noncredit  
Not Transferable.

Formerly C435, C090N. This is a pronunciation and communication course for non-native English speakers of intermediate to advanced level English proficiency. Emphasis is placed on highly accurate pronunciation and comprehension of American English speech patterns and communication skills necessary for employment, social, and academic situations. Noncredit. Pass/No Pass/Satisfactory Progress. (NOT DEGREE APPLICABLE.)

**ESL C095N** **36 Hours (36 lecture hours)**  
**ESL Support for Freshman Composition**  
**Co-requisite(s):** ENGL C100.

**Grading Mode:** P/NP/SP Noncredit  
Not Transferable.

This free, noncredit class will help prepare and support English Language Learners enrolled in Freshman Composition. Students will develop their grammar and academic reading and writing skills through activities, reading assignments, and short writing assignments, focusing especially on issues facing English language learners. Concurrent enrollment in specified sections of English C100 is required. Students are encouraged to take the writing co-requisite course, English C090, with ESL C095N. Noncredit. Pass/No Pass/Satisfactory Progress. (NOT DEGREE APPLICABLE.)
