Completion of this program will award the graduate with the Associate Degree in Nursing (ADN) and prepare the graduate for a seamless transition to a Bachelor of Science Nursing (BSN) program. The graduate is eligible to apply for the National Licensing Examination for Registered Nurses (RN-NCLEX).

Program Admissions

Applications are accepted twice a year. Admissions are offered for in the Fall and Spring semesters. Visit our website for the application filing period dates. The application is available online.

1. Be at least 18 years of age at time of admission.
2. Completion of prerequisite courses with a grade of "C" or better. Science courses must have been completed within the last 7 years.
 - a. ENGL C1000 Academic Reading and Writing / ENGL C1000E Academic Reading and Writing
 - b. PSYC G118 Life Span Developmental Psychology
 - c. COMM C1000 Introduction to Public Speaking
3. Completion of the sciences prerequisite courses with a minimum of 2.5 or higher GPA. Science courses must be completed within the last 7 years.
 - a. BIOL G220 Human Anatomy
 - b. BIOL G225 Human Physiology
 - c. BIOL G210 General Microbiology
4. Pass the TEAS with a score of 62% or higher.
5. Have adequate physical, emotional and mental health to perform the functions of a Registered Nurse. These physical and health requirements are detailed in the current college catalog. Health requirements must be cleared to complete the nursing program's clinical training.
6. Have a Coast District (GWC, OCC, Coastline) Student ID# and student email address.
 - a. For non-GWC students, complete a college application to obtain your student ID# and email address.
 - b. All correspondences related to the application is via your student email address.
7. Submit official transcripts to the GWC Admissions and Records prior to the last day of current application period. Failure to complete official transcripts will void your application.

Program Requirements

Students admitted to the Nursing Program must complete clinical training hours at our affiliated healthcare agencies. All clinical health and other requirements must be completed prior to the program start date:

1. Clear background check (criminal and/or civil) for the last 7 years.
 - a. Review the BRN website (<http://www.rn.ca.gov>) for background concerns prohibiting a graduated nurse from being eligible to take

the State RN licensure examination. Link to BRN FAQS regarding prior convictions and disciplinary actions and webinar (<https://www.rn.ca.gov/applicants/lic-faqs.shtml>).

2. Clear urine drug screening.
3. Titer and Immunizations per Healthcare Agency requirements and the Center for Disease Control (CDC) guidelines.
4. Social Security Number or Tax Identification Number (ITIN).
 - a. Required for program admission and to be eligible for the CA Board of Registered Nursing State Licensing Examination.
