# **ASSOCIATE DEGREE (AA, AS)**

Orange Coast College awards the Associate Degree to students who have met all the requirements for graduation. OCC offers the Associate in Arts and the Associate in Science Degrees. Check with your counselor to determine which degree you should complete.

In accordance with the law and with rules and regulations of the Board of Governors of the California Community Colleges and the Board of Trustees of the Coast Community College District, the requirements for the degree of Associate in Arts or Associate in Science include the following:

#### 1. Unit Requirement

60 Degree-applicable UNITS, with at least a 2.0-grade point average. At least 12 of the units must be earned in residence within the Coast Colleges (Orange Coast College, Golden West College and/ or Coastline College), with a minimum of one course taken for a letter grade. At least 3 units of major coursework from the program must be completed at OCC. A student must be enrolled at the time of application for graduation. Units earned at an accredited college or university on a credit/no credit basis will be counted toward the degree requirements of the college, to a maximum of 15 units.

### 2. Major Requirement

Complete the AA or AS major requirements as detailed in the Degree and Certificate section of this catalog.

#### 3. General Education Requirement

Students may choose to complete the OCC AA/AS GE pattern OR California General Education Transfer Curriculum (Cal-GETC) to satisfy the general education requirement. See the General Education Patterns section of this catalog for more information.

## 4. Global and Multicultural Requirement (Required for AA degree only)

Some of the courses listed in this requirement can also be used to meet General Education Requirements. Courses that are repeatable for credit can only be used once in this area.
