## UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA – ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Students planning to transfer to the University of California (UC) as upperdivision students (junior standing) must follow the requirements listed below:

- 1. Complete 60-semester units of UC transferable college work with a grade point average of at least 2.4 (2.8 for non-residents). Most campuses and majors require higher grade point averages.
- 2. Complete a general education course pattern requirement to include one of the following:
  - a. Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC) (https://catalog.cccd.edu/orange-coast/general-educationpatterns/associate-degree-general-education-option-3/) or
  - b. UC 7-Course Pattern by the end of the spring term prior to fall enrollment:
    - i. Four UC transferable college courses (three semester or four to five quarter units each) selected from at least two of the following subject areas:
      - 1. Arts and Humanities
      - 2. Social and Behavioral Sciences
      - 3. Physical and Biological Sciences.
    - ii. One UC transferable college course (three semester or four to five quarter units each) in mathematical concepts and quantitative reasoning; and
    - iii. Two UC transferable college courses (three semester or four to five quarter units each) in English Composition
- Complete the required/ recommended courses needed for your intended major with the minimum grades specified by your intended campus
